In order to get the wordsearch macro to work with newer versions of Word, it is necessary to install my "local" security certificate. I'm sorry about this, but the only other option is for me to pay \$300 a year to get an authenticated certificate, which is it a bit over the top!

Note, you only need to go through this rigamarole once!

When you first open the wordsearch template, you will see this:
